Readings for 10<sup>th</sup> June 2018: Trinity 2 Community Sunday

### First Reading: Proverbs 10:28 — 11:2

- <sup>28</sup>The prospect of the righteous is joy, but the hopes of the wicked come to nothing.
- <sup>29</sup>The way of the LORD is a refuge for the blameless, but is the ruin of those who do evil.
- <sup>30</sup>The righteous will never be uprooted, but the wicked will not remain in the land.
- <sup>31</sup>From the mouth of the righteous comes the fruit of wisdom, but a perverse tongue will be silenced.
- <sup>32</sup>The lips of the righteous know what finds favour, but the mouth of the wicked only what is perverse.
- <sup>1</sup>The LORD detests dishonest scales, but accurate weights find favour with Him.
- <sup>2</sup>When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with humility comes wisdom.

### Second Reading: Matthew 22: 35 — 40

- <sup>35</sup>One, an expert in the law, tested [Jesus] with this question:
- <sup>36</sup>“Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?”
- <sup>37</sup>Jesus replied: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.” <sup>38</sup>This is the first and greatest commandment. <sup>39</sup>And the second is like it: “Love your neighbour as yourself.”
- <sup>40</sup>All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.’

### Third Reading: Philippians 4: 4 — 9

- <sup>4</sup>Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: rejoice!
- <sup>5</sup>Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near.
- <sup>6</sup>Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.
- <sup>7</sup>And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
- <sup>8</sup>Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things. <sup>9</sup>Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me – put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

### COLLECT

Lord, you have taught us that all our doings without love are nothing worth: send your Holy Spirit and pour into our hearts that most excellent gift of love, the true bond of peace and of all virtues, without which whoever lives is counted dead before you. Grant this for your only Son Jesus Christ's sake, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
